<u>Colorado Trail, Segment 6, Kenosha Pass to Breckenridge</u> <u>Wheeler Geologic Area, La Garita Wilderness</u>

The BPX trips I did this year fell between September 1st - October 9. Just beautiful! Only caveat is you need a little orange - hunting season is on. I am totally sold on Colorado's "Leaf-Peeping" season for BPX backpack trips. Reasons a plenty. Here are a few. Exchanging the hot summer days for comfortable late summer and early fall days. Think warm days, cool nights. Bug season is over. The monsoon season is pretty much over. How about less crowds? Yes, folks are all over Colorado 'peepin'; but mostly in cars. The colors! Fall colors popping all over the state. Just gorgeous!

Two trips I did are must do's trips for Colorado backpackers. The Colorado Trail, Segment 6, from

Kenosha Pass to Breckenridge. I'm now calling this the Breck for Beer trip. You can do it as we did it - a 3 day chill backpack. Or a one day mountain bike ride from Kenosha Pass to Breckenridge. A 5 star trip for sure.

The other was the Wheeler Geologic Area trip in the La Garita Wilderness. If you have not been there, put it on your list. Consider it mountain art, over 30 million years in the making. Just fantastic! 5 stars, too.

Here are this season's favorite backpacking/camping items from your BPX Committee:

<u>Uwe Sartori, Chair:</u> Pillow. With all the lightweight pillow options there are now, after a long day on the trail, just say "NO" to resting your weary head on a stuff sack filled with lumpy clothes (which you probably will raid during the night when you get cold).

<u>Louise Campbell-Blair, Vice Chair and Treasurer: Katadyn Befree water filter (1 Liter)</u>. I love this collapsible water filter/water bottle. It is light weight, easy to store, and doubles as a water bottle as well as a filter.

<u>Lisa Shroyer, Trip Leader Coordinator:</u> <u>Hummingbird ultralight hammock</u>, for setting up at camp and relaxing with a book after hiking in. It packs so little and is so lightweight! I used it in the Grand Canyon this spring and all over Colorado this summer.

<u>Craig Townsend, BPX Committee Member:</u> My sons. There's nothing like spending time in the backcountry with them...

<u>Susan Quechenberger, Membership Coordinator:</u> <u>GoalZero Flip 24</u> or <u>Flip 36 charger</u>. There's so much to be charged about in the backcountry these days—cell phone, GPS, watch, Kindle, speaker loaded with the greatest hits of John Denver...

<u>Maggie Burns, Event and Social Media Coordinator</u>: Peanut M&Ms. We all remember from Wilderness Trekking School that your body needs fuel when you are out on adventures, and it's imperative it's something you like to eat...

<u>Leila Murphy, Communications Coordinator and Newsletter Editor:</u> <u>Little Kamper 1Ib Refillable Propane</u> <u>Tank</u>. Finally, a solution to my ever-expanding collection of empty propane canisters. You purchase a prefilled 1Ib tank at a local participating Little Kamper retailer, use it, and then exchange it for a pre-filled replacement. Little Kamper is affiliated with ACE Hardware stores, so if your local store doesn't have them, you can ask them to become a retailer.
