#### New Fee at Eldorado Canyon State Park

The state office will then remit the fees to ECSP.

Alternatively, parking is available at the Morrison Park 'n Ride at the NE intersection of West Morrison Road and South Rooney Road near C-470.



## Octo Hikes: A New CMC Hiking Series

Octogenarian (Octo) Hikes are in their third successful year as a CMC hiking series. With 11 hikes posted at the beginning of the season, every spot is now filled. But, if you're interested in joining, don't hesitate to register and be placed on a waitlist.

Although anyone may join an Octo Hike, they are designed for CMC members in their 70s and 80s who age out of normal CMC hikes. Octo Hikes offer shorter mileage (around 5 miles), less elevation gain (around 500'), a slower pace (around 1.5 mph moving average), and more frequent stops.

Two trip leaders are used so that the primary leader has help should someone be injured or ill on the trail. Satellite communicators are also carried to get help on scene more quickly if needed. Long-time CMC members who age out of regular CMC hikes enjoy reconnecting socially with old friends or making new ones. Several have even rejoined the CMC to get back into the mountains with fellow Octos.

Trip leaders are needed to continue this series after its founders pass the baton. This is a great opportunity for new trip leaders to gain experience on easier hikes with another trip leader to share responsibilities. To volunteer, please call the CMC Office at 303-279-3080.




