



#### Peter Ismert – October 11th

# Presentation by Peter Ismert Brown Bears at Brook Fall Katmai National Park 7pm

Peter will provide an overview of Katmai National Park, particularly the Brooks Falls area and a "how to" on planning and getting to Katmai.

Peter is a photographer and environmental scientist who creates images and visual stories that engage our emotional connections with nature and illustrate work being done to protect and restore ecosystems. His photography builds off his long career of protecting and restoring waterways in the western United States through watershed studies, stream restoration projects, and water quality protection.

Peter applies his environmental experience to his photography and storytelling that is about the diverse wildlife and landscapes of the Rocky Mountain states. Peter specializes in capturing candid moments of wildlife behavior to convey the beauty of all species and to illustrate the need to protect and restore their habitat. In addition, he likes to travel to Botswana, Zambia, Kenya, and recently to South Africa to photograph wildlife and to see first-hand the most pressing environmental issues in Africa. This has broadened his outlook on the power of conservation photography and visual storytelling.

He hopes that his photography helps enable community-based environmental protection, an approach that connects communities with nature, that enlightens communities about their own natural environment and educates people about the science and hard work needed for its protection. Ultimately this inspires communities to take action to protect ecosystems and the services they provide.

Peter grew up near Denver, Colorado and still lives there with his wife who is often a partner in his photography and storytelling adventures. They also live part time in Crestone, CO, a small mountain town in the San Luis Valley. He has explored local environmental issues with photography and many of his images have been published in local media outlets, online photography and conservation magazines, government scientific publications, and have been shown in local and online photography galleries.

#### Image Submission and Evaluation – New Format

#### Photo submission:

Send images to Frank Burzynski (fburzynski@comcast.net by October 9<sup>th</sup>).

Take a moment to review the specifics below before sending images to ensure this part of the program proceeds smoothly. **Limit the file size to 5MB or less**.

We will display member images in two categories going forward as we proceed we can refine and adjust this section of the program based upon our experiences and the needs of the membership. We hope this will keep the program moving at a good pace and provide the opportunity for the improvement of our skills.

Option One:

#### Image Evaluation

Members <u>anonymously</u> submit up to <u>two</u> images from our group's most recent outing, or related to the topic presented the previous month. Each image will be reviewed briefly. The review will be done by the professional presenter, or by an experienced member of our group when there is no professional presenter.

This month: Please submit two images from either of the recent outings (Botanic Gardens or Barr Lake. Alternately you may select images that are in line with last month's presentation which we will expand to the topic of Adventure Travel), do not include your name.


Option Two:

#### **Two Minute Member Share**

Each member is encouraged to submit two to three images for sharing and will have two minutes to present information about these images to the group. <u>Include your full name</u> as part of the file name. This will not include group discussion however feel free to engage each other during breaks or after the program for exchanging ideas or comments.

#### **CMC** Website Tip

Completing this one item will enroll you to receive prompt notice of any photography related hike as it is placed on the calendar. Login to the CMC web site, then navigate to your name on the top right of the page, a drop-down menu will appear. Navigate in the drop-down menu to the heading My Preferences, click on this item. The Preferences page will appear, scroll to the bottom for the section "Alerts and Notification Preferences", select how you want to be notified and then add the keyword "Photography" under the activities portion, lastly click save at the bottom of the page.



#### Shooter's Choice Volunteers

The photography group is diverse, with numerous photographic interests and skill levels. We are looking for presentations about any interest at any skill level. The concept of Shooter's Choice is to learn about both photography and the lessons learned on our unique photographic journeys. This may include photos from a single day trip, a vacation, or decades of experience, but should primarily address the photography performed along the journey. Presentations may last 45-60 minutes. It may be single person's work or a group of people may split that time.

A Shooter's Choice presentation involves selecting a related set of photographs to discuss. These need not be polished photos. They may address an exploration of one subject, an experiment, an attempt to solve a problem, or the key results of your learning curve through your journey.

The presentation may include:

- 1. What you liked or disliked about the photos and what you might do differently next time.
- 2. How the photograph was taken (if pertinent include camera mode, lens, focus, depth of field, ISO, shutter speed, etc.)
- 3. What challenges you addressed, and the successes and failures you had.

Your Shooter's Choice can be a great way to improve your photography skills and meet people with like photographic interests. We look forward to seeing your photographs!
